From the CEO's desk



Ensure your vehicles, windows, doors and gates are locked and take valuable items with you -(including keys) or keep it secure and out of sight.

Keep your property clear of loose items that could cause damage during extreme winds and don't let thieves help themselves by leaving handy tools and stools/ladders outside your house.

Unplug your appliances before you leave to avoid power surges and to safe energy, electric water heaters are especially known to use a lot of electricity even when you don't use it.

Clear the fridges, dispose all perishable food and empty the bins. Just in case the power went off, the last thing you want is rotten smell and thawed fluid all over your house.

Shut off the water main. Even a small water leak can cause a big damage if its left unnoticed for days, worse, it could flood your house and leave you with heavy maintenance and water bills.

Turn your fans on as Darwin can be very humid, you don't want to go back to a mouldy house.

Ask a trusted friend or neighbour to check your house every now and then.

If you are going away for an extended period, please let your property manager know so that we are aware and can keep an eye on the house.
